In late May 2023 Tresco attended the annual Source America X Force Conference, a national gathering of non-profit agencies who do contract work with the federal government utilizing the Ability One program, in Anaheim, California. Our contracts at White Sands Missile Range, with the Navy at WSMR, the Commissary, High Energy Laser Systems Testing Facility (HELSTF), the Las Cruces Federal Courthouse, BLM sites in Dona Ana county and the USGS offices on the NMSU campus are all examples of our Ability One efforts.
