GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY CONFERENCE WORKS





This past September, Robert Reynolds, HELSTF Materials Coordinator and Stacie Allen, Community Engagement Manager, embarked on an important journey to Washington D.C. to attend the SourceAmerica Grassroots Self-Advocacy conference. This annual conference brings together employees with disabilities, their families and employers from across the country who are part of SourceAmerica's network of nonprofit agencies to advocate for rights and inclusion of people with disabilities in the workforce. This year there were over 60 self-advocates who shared their story with conference attendees and members of Congress on creating more accessible employment opportunities for people with differing abilities and support the AbilityOne program, which is the nation's largest providers of jobs for people who are blind or have significant disabilities.

Throughout the trip our Tresco Works team met with staff members from Senator MartinHeinrich, Senator Ben Ray Lujan, Representative Gabe Vasquez and Representative Melanie Stansbury's office. These meetings were focused on discussing critical issues facing the disability community, such as AbilityOne Contracting Goal and SSI Savings Penalty Elimination Act. In addition, Robert and Stacie were able to share the great work being done in New Mexico through the efforts of Tresco Works.

By bringing these voices to Capitol Hill, Tresco Works hopes to create lasting change that will improve the lives of people with disabilities in New Mexico and across the country.
